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

Nominate your Favorite Motorized RTP Project for Award

The Coalition for Recreational Trails (CRT), a federation of national and regional trail-related organizations, is pleased to announce its 2010 achievement awards to recognize outstanding trail projects funded by the national Recreational Trails Program (RTP). The awards will be presented in Washington, D.C. during Great Outdoors Week 2010 (June 7-13), as part of the Coalition's ongoing effort to build awareness and appreciation of this highly successful program, which has greatly enhanced the quantity and quality of trail experiences available to the public. They are planning to hold the awards ceremony on Capitol Hill and encourage Members of Congress to join in honoring the outstanding achievements of their constituents.

Award winners will be selected from projects nominated by public agencies, trail administrators or other project sponsors. Projects must be completed in order to receive an award. In addition, projects completed before 1998 are ineligible. Project award categories will include: construction and design; maintenance and rehabilitation; education and communication initiatives; accessibility enhancement; multiple-use management or "corridor sharing"; environment/wildlife compatibility; and use of youth conservation/service corps.



DRIFT Racing's Premier Oval Racer Wins Grey Eagle Ovals

Plymouth, Minn. (Feb. 26, 2010) – DRIFT Racing's P.J. Wanderscheid maintained his dominant form last weekend at the Oval Racers Alliance event in Grey Eagle, Minn., winning the coveted Champ 440 final and taking second in Pro 600.

In Champ 440, the Sauk Center, Minn., native swept all three rounds of qualifying and was the top qualifier. The expectations were high for the final, and P.J. delivered, passing into the lead on the second lap and taking the win with an 8-second margin of victory aboard his Amsoil-sponsored Arctic Cat.

"Our Champ sled is absolutely amazing," said Wanderscheid. "We've worked hard to get the handling and speed to where it is, and now all that's left is for me to race my best. When that happens, we win."

Wanderscheid nailed first and second place finishes in the Pro 600 qualifiers. Racing from the pole position, Wanderscheid battled with Gary Moyle for all 12 laps to take second-place.

"Gary is a great racer and we battled hard with each other," said Wanderscheid. "While of course I wanted to win that class, taking the Champ 440 win is the most important class for us."

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30-WIN WEEKEND FOR TEAM ARCTIC

Crushing the Competition in USCC Cross-Country

Thief River Falls, Minn. (Feb. 16, 2010) - It was a weekend that will go down as one of the greatest in Team Arctic history.

With two USCC cross-country races on tap, Team Arctic racers went on a winning spree that might never again be equaled: taking 15 of 18 class victories in Grand Forks and 14 of 18 wins in Fargo. Add a class win at the ISOC National snocross in New Hampshire, and this Valentine weekend was a victory love-fest of epic proportions.

Cross-country Pro racer and Arctic Cat engineer Brian Dick delivered an all-star performance, winning the Pro 600 class at both events, plus taking a first and second in the Pro Open classes, his teammate D.J. Ekre squeaking past for the Open win and three more podium finishes.

With three-of-four Semi Pro class victories, the top-9 in both Expert 85 classes and a Team Arctic podium sweep of 14 classes over the weekend, it's never been more apparent that Arctic Cat owns cross-country racing.

"Our commitment to win in the most demanding terrain is unmatched and our Sno Pro 600 and 500s are the perfect sleds to win with," said Mike Kloety, Team Arctic Race Manager.

He added, "Brian taking three of four Pro classes is a huge

step for him. Teams like Brother's Motorsports Racing have brought massive support and winning results. And our individual racers and crew members have reinvigorated the sport's truest form of competition while completely dominating it."

While the cross-country team swept the North Dakota rounds of the USCC schedule, Team Arctic snocross racers rolled into the ISOC New England Nationals in Salem, NH, where Factory Team pilot Kyle Pallin took his second Semi Pro Stock victory in two weeks. Pallin's win was bolstered by the podium finishes of Logan Christian in Semi Pro Stock and Open, as well as Cory Davis' third in Pro Open.

"Nineteen podium finishes in snocross coupled with 30 total victories is a weekend that might never be matched by a single team," said Kloety.

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TEAM ARCTIC CLEANS HOUSE

Sweeps Away the Competition in Hillclimb, Cross Country and Snocross

Thief River Falls, Minn. (Feb. 22, 2010) - Team Arctic racers got out the broom again this past weekend, methodically sweeping their classes – and the competition – in snocross, cross-country and hillclimb events across the country.

The most complete class-cleaning occurred at the RMSHA hillclimb in Afton, Wyo., where Team Arctic racers won an astounding 14 classes - including a sweep of the 800 Stock, Improved and Mod classes with the best-selling M8 HCR - plus three King of the Mountain titles.

Add to the tally wins in 600, 700, 1000, and Open classes, and it's evident that the ever-versatile Arctic Cat's M Series can climb mountains and clean the competition's clocks.

"We won more than half the classes in Afton, and at least one final in every engine category," said Mike Kloety, Team Arctic Race Manager. "This was just the third race in the RMSHA schedule and our best performance of the season, so clearly the team's trajectory is pointed to the top."

While the hill-climbers were standing the highest out west, Team Arctic's eastern contingent welcomed USCC crosscountry to Tug Hill, NY, for the first time. And with their welcome came the obligatory door-slam-in-the-face of the competition, as the guys in green stood atop of the podium in six classes.

The trip to Tug Hill by Team Arctic/Christian Bros. Racing star D.J. Ekre proved worthwhile, as he led a sweep of the Pro classes aboard his Sno Pro 600, while helping kick-off crosscountry racing on the east coast.

National-level snocross racing made its first and only foray into Canada this weekend, at the ISOC Canadian Nationals/ CSRA regional in Sarnia, Ontario. Four class victories highlighted the team's success as it presses to finish the season strong and on top of the points' battles. Semi Pro stalwarts Cody Thomsen and Logan Christian each won a class and took third on another, with Christian leaving Sarnia with the points lead in both classes.

Update on Matt Judnick ankle injury - He doing very well. Matt has had intense physical therapy since his accident. He is chomping at the bit to get back out there.



Hayden in top form at Georgia Downs

lain Hayden was in top form at Round 3 of the CSRA Snocross Championship at Georgian Downs in Barrie this past weekend. The team Monster Energy-Yamaha-OTSFF Racing ace garnered a solid second place in the Open Pro final in defence of his current lead in the points chase.

In Saturday's qualifying, Hayden piloted his fourstroke Yamaha FX Nytro[®] to a holeshot in the first heat of the Royal Distributing Cup, which he led till a red flag stopped the race. On the restart Hayden claimed another holeshot but by the end of the race he found himself taking satisfaction with a second place finish.

In the second round of qualifiers on Sunday, Hayden poured on the gas to nail down a win in the first race and another noteworthy second place in heat two.

Buoyed by his top qualifier results and a front row starting

position, Hayden shot out of the gate in the final to secure yet another holeshot. But main rival in the series and defending Pro Open Champion, Lee Butler, had every intention of staying with Hayden and he did so from the time they dove into the first turn. It was obviously going to be a two-sled race.

The two champions set such a blistering pace vying for the lead that by the time the checkered was waved

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Hayden rules at Quick Draw ISOC Canadian Nationals in Sarnia

Things unfolded nicely with a Pro Open win for Team Monster Energy-Yamaha-OTSFF Racing's Ian Hayden at the ISOC Amsoil® Snocross Championship Series Quick **Draw Canadian Nationals** in Sarnia, Ontario this past weekend. In addition to campaigning the Quick Draw National, which counts towards the CSRA Canadian National Championship, Hayden also rode Round 7 of the ISOC National Series. Despite some problems with his goggles, he still pulled a noteworthy top-10 finish out of his sleeve in that division.

"It was another banner weekend for us with lain getting lots of track time and the resultant television exposure," said team owner/manager Andre Laurin. "His win in the Quick Draw ISOC Canadian National and top 10 in the ISOC National put the icing on the cake."

Thanks to the city of Sarnia, which trucked in tons of snow to Hiawatha Horsepark so the races could proceed as scheduled, the ISOC event offered up top-notch competition that saw American, European and Canadian riders vie for podium finishes at the US/Canadian border town.

In the Quick Draw Canadian National, which was Hayden's main focus for the weekend, he again went head-to-head with defending Pro Open CSRA National champ Lee Butler. But whereas Butler managed to beat Hayden to the finish line at the previous event in Barrie, he was no match for Hayden in Sarnia and this time he was the one who had to settle for second place.

gressed through the qualifying races with a second place in the first heat and a win in the second heat. This gave him second gate pick on the starting line for the final. Knowing he had to keep Butler from a win if he was going to keep his lead in the CSRA National Championship Series, Hayden took off like a bat out of hell on his explosive Yamaha FX Nytro® to grab the holeshot and then lead wire to wire.

Although Butler mounted some challenges throughout the 20-lap race, he never really threatened Hayden for position. Still, Butler's 1-1 qualifying heat results and the second place finish in the final gave him enough points on the weekend to tie Hayden for first place in the title hunt.

For snocross fans, the results in Sarnia have definitely set the stage for a thriller final round on April 10th at Horseshoe Valley in Barrie, where

In the ISOC National round, Hayden finished fifth in his first qualifying heat after a fairly routine race. In the second heat, which he holeshot, he experienced visibility problems due to a malfunction in his goggle tear-off system, caused by the roost of the rider in front of him. Just missing qualifying for the final, he had to go to the LCQ in which he grabbed a third place at the checkered, and along with it a back row starting position for the final.

In the 20-lap final, incredibly Hayden was again hampered by visibility problems due to problems with the tear-offs. But he soldiered on to claw his way from the back of the 15-rider field to a ninth place finish when the checkered flag

signalled the end of the race.

Other than the tear-off problems it was a great weekend. As usual the team guys put a great sled under me and it ran like a dream. We went to Sarnia to win the Quick Draw Canadian National race and it was mission accomplished," said Hayden. "It would have been nice to keep my lead in the points but we've known from the beginning of the season it was going to go down to the last round, because Lee wasn't just going to hand me the title on a silver plate. He's a champion, a worthy opponent and a great sled racer."

Quebec riders took the next four positions with Dany Poirier of Saint-Théodore d'Acton finishing third ahead of Dave Asselin of La Doré, Keven Benoit of Notre-Dame du Bon Conseil and Dave Allard of Saint-Félicien.

THE GRAND PRIX OF VALCOURT And The Winner Is?

Valcourt, QC, February 21, 2010 — Nicholas Van Strydonk of Tomahawk, Wisconsin won today the 28th Grand Prix of Valcourt, presented by La Capitale General Insurance. It was his first career Pro Champ Grand Prix win on Sunday at Valcourt's Circuit Yvon Duhamel. 2010 World Champion Matt Schultz of Wausau, WI led the first four of the 15-lap affair, but he had to relinquish the lead to Jacques Villeneuve following a mechanical breakdown. The Saint-Cuthbert driver led the next seven laps pursued by two-time defending champion Dustin Wahl from Greenbush, Minnesota. Entering corner four on lap 12, Wahl and Villeneuve touched, and they both went off-course. Wahl got up after the incident as did Villeneuve, but the latter was taken to the hospital for a precautionary check-up.

Following the race stoppage, Van Strydonk inherited the lead on the restart and led the final five laps to the checkered flag, followed by Travis MacDonald of Lackport, Manitoba. His teammate Brian Bewcik from Winnipeg finished third ahead of Nick Lagoy from Morrisonville, NY. Jason Lavallée of Drummondville was the top Quebec finisher with a fifth place.

Saturday's Pro Champ on Sunday morning

Sunday schedule began early with Saturday's postponed Pro Champ finale because of the freezing rain with Dustin Wahl, Jacques Villeneuve, Matt Schultz, and Nicholas Van Strydonk, all winners in the heat qualifying races on Saturday, on the front row for the start of the race with eight other drivers also vying for the win. Villeneuve took the lead on lap two but a red flag stopped the race when Félipe Roy-Lalonde of St-Jude, QC went off course in corner one. On the restart, Van Strydonk went first, and a few laps later Wahl passed Villeneuve for second, then Strydonk on his way to his first Pro Champ finale win of the weekend. 2010 World Champion Matt Schultz finished fourth, followed by Nick Lagoy.

In the other Sunday Grand Finale, Brett Turcotte of Clearwater, British Colombia took an easy win in the Snocross Pro Open race held Sunday to write his name in the Valcourt Grand Prix record book. Turcotte crossed the finish line ahead of Quebec riders Mathieu Morin of Val d'Or, Dave Allard of St-Félicien, and Dave Asselin of La Doré. However, Mathieu's second place finish gave him enough points to win the final leg of the Triple Crown with 420 points to 370 for Bobby Lep-

age of St. Johnsville, NY who finished eight in the race.

Back to the ice oval Eastern Pro Tour championship. Winner at Valcourt in 2008 and 2009, Serge Ouellet of Lachute, QC made it three in-a-row in 2010 winning the 10-lap Pro Formula 500 class race to stretch his lead in the championship standings over Dustin Gehrke of Morrisonville, NY who finished fifth in the race. Ouellet won his fifth class race of the season over Ontario riders Rob Sheppard of Mindemoya and Ben Harris from Douglas. Andrew Spencer of Rome, NY finished fourth.

Maxime Sylvestre of Joliette, QC, won the motocross 450cc 12-lap race ahead of Karl Daigle of Sherbrooke, QC. Starting second, Sylvestre moved past Daigle for lead on lap 10 to win Sunday's feature motocross race. Daniel Desbiens from L'Ange Gardien, QC finished third. Desbiens caused a red flag on lap three when he went off course in corner two of the ice oval track. Starting at the back of the field, he went by five other riders on the restart lap, to move into third place but was unable to catch the leaders.

In ATV action, Richard Pelchat of Saint Romuald, QC led from the green to win ahead of Jean-François Thériault of St-Côme. Thériault challenged Pelchat at the start of the race, but was no match for the winner who crossed the finish line with a fairly good lead at the end of 10 laps. Jasmin Plante of Notre-Dame du Bon Conseil moved past Marc-Antoine Auger of Laurier Station with two laps to go to finish third.

Lincoln Lemieux of St. Johnsbury, Vermont won Sunday's Camoplast Snocross Championship Semi-Pro Super Stock 600 class 12-lap race. The American rider won over Pierre-Vincent Fillion of Desbiens, QC. Fillion's second place finish moved him into first place of the Semi Pro Super Stock 600 class ahead of Donovan Asselin who finished eighth in the race. Dex Savage of Chibougamau, QC took third place ahead of Chris Ackerman from Jericho, Vermont and Franky Paré of Roberval, QC.

The 29th edition of the Grand Prix de Valcourt will be held February 18-19 and 20, 2011.

held the "Fastest Show on Ice" on Lake Menomin in Menomonie, Wisconsin for the second race of the NSSR Super Series.

Temperatures ranged from -5 to +15 degrees F with winds varying from 5 to 10 mph and from the Northwest to Southwest during the day. The track was aimed straight South. The Stage was set for the Guinness World Record Attempt sponsored by ProLine Performance and Bellman Oil.

Mr. Dick Gokey, President of International Snowmobile Racing (ISR), was on hand to witness the runs of each of the contestants and verify the timing system for proper placement. The Pro Track was plowed and shaved for a distance of 5500 feet at 75 feet wide and timers were placed at 1000 feet and 1320 feet. Two timing systems were used to record numbers for the 1320 foot distance. The normal NSSR Class System was run at the 1000 foot mark.

Racer entries included nearly 100 on the Pro track and over 40 on the Fun Run track for over 600 passes. Five Records were broke and included Ryan Doberstein of Competition

Sports Equipment (CSE Racing) setting the Stock Turbo Four Stroke Record on his 2009 Artic Cat Z1 machine at 108.270 mph and Shanon Disch on the CPR Simons Yamaha bumping up the Improved Stock Four Stroke Record up to 159.409 mph in 1000 feet. Over 500 fans were on hand to witness the history in the making.

Background: The Official Guinness Record is currently set at 172.2 mph on a single engine sled by Chris Hanson of Minnesota on his Anderson Lay Down Mod in Canada. A pending Guinness run was made in 2009 at North Bay Ontario at 190.0 mph in 2000 feet by Tom McConkey on his DNE powered Lay Down Mod. Guinness does not establish records for snow-mobiles in distance, but on different surfaces with absolute records. A snowmobile was further defined when asked for clarification as: "A vehicle whose sole form of propulsion is a track at the rear and which runs on a ski or skis at the front. The rider should sit astride the machine and steering should be via handlebars."

The NSSR Record for the guarter mile run was set in 1989



at 190.308 mph for a competition that was held in International Falls, Mn by Marv Jorgenson on his triple mercury engine JAWS 3. He then backed it up with a run at 189 mph and well within the 2% requirement of NSSR. This record currently stands as the official quarter mile record for a multi engine snowmobile at NSSR.

Final Entrants for the 2010 Guinness Run included Fast Eddie Ensor on his 2009 Busa Mod and tuner Glenn Stickels of RPM Specialties made the trip from Sheridan, Illinois; Jack Henricks of Henricks Racing out of Rhinelander, Wisconsin came on his One Stop Performance (OSP) Yamaha along with OSP owner Jim McKeown; Paul Groth, driver, along with Owner Jim and Bernie Warning debuted the "Frozen Assets" Tubo V8 powered machine out of New Lenox, Illinois; and Justin Durand of Rice Lake, Wisconsin with Glen Hall to assist on his black beauty Turbo powered VMax 4.

The Guinness Runs were held at 4 different times during the day. Paul Groth, the famous Bud Sno King driver, in Frozen Assets was put on the ice for the first time on Friday for testing and over powered the ice with its twin turbo V8. The crew worked hard to overcome some traction issues and posted a best run at 110.83 mph at the 1000 foot mark. Paul vowed to get the bugs worked out and return to Forest Lake, Mn. Justin Durand made a pass in the Super Mod Class on Saturday on the Turbo VMax 4 to over boost and blow out the crank seals putting him on the trailer for the rest of the day. The Guinness Runs were intense with Fast Eddie Ensor and Jack Henricks going head to head in each round. Round 1 took off with Ed Ensor posting a 177.777 mph run in the quarter while Jack and the OSP team made adjustments after posting a 171.769 mph pass in 1000 feet in the Pro Max Class. Round 2 heated up with Jack Henricks posting a 183.439 mph pass and Ed Ensor then overcoming with a 184.615 mph pass, both in the quarter mile. Round 3 gained more excitement with racers and fans at attention with Fast Eddie running a 188.646 mph pass followed

by the Henricks OSP Yamaha at 178.881 mph. Round 4 was even more intense as the racing action was closing in on a fantastic sunset and a full day of racing action. All the racers and fans gathered as Jack Henricks led the round by blasting out a fantastic run at 189.473 mph on the OSP Yamaha and securing the lead as Fast Eddie prepared to make his last pass. Eddie Ensor took off with a roaring powerful blast and full boost only to have the motor stall at about 300 feet out. The 189.473 mph Record Run will be submitted to the Guinness World Record if the pending 190.0 mph run is not approved in the near future, as all the documentation is being assembled per their guidelines.

The racing action was over with the winner of the Guinness Record Run and the Top Speed of the Day set by Jack Henricks on his OSP powered Yamaha! Jack Henricks will be listed as the fastest of the fastest on a single engine machine with a Top Speed of 189.473 mph in the quarter mile at NSSR!

This NSSR Super Series event in Menomonie, Wisconsin was hosted by Rod's Performance Shop of Durand, Wi., along with the Country Inn and Suites and Pember Excavating of Menomonie. A big thank you to the National Speed Run Group (NSRG) of Minnesota who provided the use of their timing equipment and Owner Andy Bray with daughter Carlie who ran the Fun Run Track record keeping. Legend George of Kenosha, Wi. provided a fantastic sound system for the event. A special thanks to the Menomonie Fire and Rescue for providing Safety and EMT services for this event, along with the cooperation of the City of Menomonie, the Dunn County Sheriffs Office, and the Wisconsin DNR. The tie was continued with runs in the 143 mph and 142 mph, but broken by the best back up speed four runs back of Tom Warner at 141.407 mph on his Polaris Ultra compared to Mike Cleary at 141.176 mph on his Ski Doo Mach Z. Talk about crazy racing!




